Care Assistant/Support Worker (£12.92 p/h)

For our elderly clients, it may be that the only people they see that day are In Caring Hands staff. While our job is to carry out practical or personal tasks for them, it is also to engage with them, build connections, and ensure that these people continue to feel like valued members of our society. Outreach, for older clients, could include listening to their stories, being taught how to knit, making a cake from an old family recipe, or helping them go through family photos. Your visit might be the highlight of their week, so it's a lot more than simply giving care. We value this interaction with our clients, and will pay staff mileage at 45p per mile, and for their travel time, at their standard hourly rate, to ensure that staff are fairly recognised for their effort and time.
