Responsibilities and Duties

As a Waking Night Support Worker, you will be responsible for delivering high quality, person-centred care, working as part of a rota system with your colleagues.

The role is for supporting individuals who have complex health needs (such as Epilepsy and Cerebral Palsy alongside profound learning disabilities) overnight, in their own/family homes.

We are currently looking to recruit a part time position, approximately 20hrs per week with the option of additional day hours available if required.

Qualifications and Skills

In the caring profession, the skills you need can be taught, and we make a commitment to train all our staff and continue developing their skills throughout the time they work with us. Compassion, kindness, and empathy can't be taught, together with the ability to get along with people, even if they are elderly, disabled, grumpy, sick, or just having a bad day.
